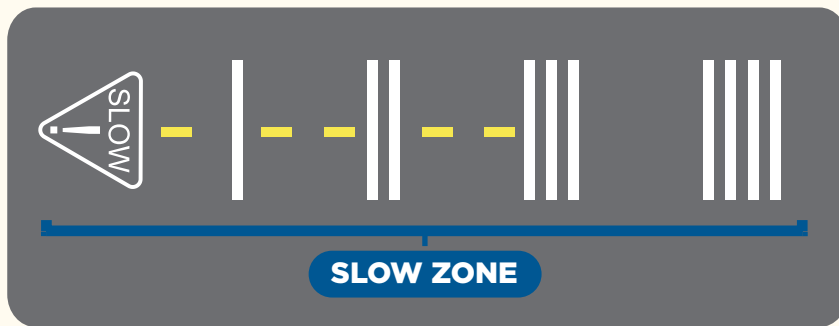


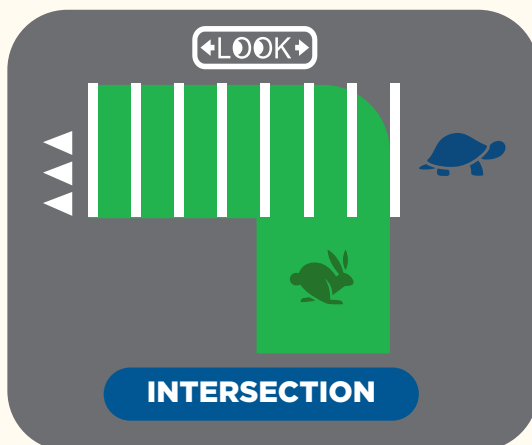
The Pathway Safety & Improvement Project

This fall, the **Mass. Department of Conservation & Recreation (DCR)** and the **Esplanade Association** installed new safety paint as part of our **Pathway Safety & Improvement Project**. The goal of the project is to help visitors slow down when approaching tricky intersections, and to clarify which pathway is better for slower or faster visitors. Look out for the **new safety paint** at the Massachusetts Avenue Ramp, the Esplanade Playspace, and the Fanny Appleton Footbridge!



When you see these markings, you're approaching an intersection - **use caution**, and look out for your fellow park visitors.

Always **look both ways** before entering or crossing an intersection.



→ *Taking your time?
Follow the stripes.*

→ *Gotta go fast?
Take the green path!*

At forked intersections, pick a path based on your speed of travel. With the new paint, the stripes lead to the scenic route and the **green path is for a faster trip**.

At other intersections, speedy visitors should look for the yellow dashed lines. Where there is only one path, **slow down and keep right** except to pass.
